Lydia M. Logan is executive director of the Institute for a Competitive Workforce (ICW), a nonprofit affiliate of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce that promotes high educational standards and effective workforce training systems so that they are aligned with each other and with the today's business demands. Mrs. Logan first joined the Chamber in January of 2006 as the National Program Manager for the Business Civic Leadership Center's Business Education Network (BEN).

Prior to joining the U.S. Chamber, Mrs. Logan served as Vice President of Programs for the Kimsey Foundation. During her six year tenure there, she was responsible for developing new policies, partnerships and initiatives, and managing the foundation's ten million dollar education grant portfolio.
