Dual Enrollment: “On Ramp” Policies and Practices

Practices

- Coherent sequence of courses leading to degree or credential
- Authentic college courses and credit
- Low/No-Tuition
- Support systems
- Alignment of K-12 and Postsecondary standards

Policies

- Do-no-harm financing
- Tuition waiver or support
- Credit transfer assured
- Quality
- Start-Up



State “On Ramp” Policy Examples

Georgia: ACCEL for dual enrollees, P-16 data



Federal Policy Role

- Do no harm
- Align with similar federal programs
- Encourage “On Ramp” programs and state support for them (e.g., “Fast Track to College to College Act”)
