

A VISION FOR REDESIGNED HIGH SCHOOLS

Professional Development for State Policy Leaders

The American Youth Policy Forum, working with the National Conference of State Legislatures, is planning a series of field trips to help state policy leaders learn more about innovative high school redesign policies across the country. This project, funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, supports the *Honor States Grant Program*, an initiative of the National Governors Association, by providing hands-on professional development activities to governors, their staffs, state legislators, members of state boards of education, and other education leaders.

Trips will facilitate knowledge sharing between participants and district and state-level leaders at the site, as well as provide time for participants to take away practical lessons by visiting redesigned high schools and other promising programs.
