






























Misbehaviors that may interfere with achievement are not necessarily signs of bad intentions.

AGENCY

Agency is the capacity and propensity to take purposeful action—the opposite of helplessness. Young people with high levels of agency do not respond passively to their circumstances. They take deliberate steps to achieve the outcomes they desire in their own and others' lives.

Agency is not a fixed trait. Instead, parents and teachers help to inspire, enable, and focus it by the opportunities and guidance they provide.

How? Work on every part of the predicament to shape opportunities and experiences from birth through early adulthood.



Two Compelling Facts


- Racial, ethnic, socio-economic, even gender skill gaps in the U.S. are very clear in national data by the age of two.

A dense neural network by the age of 2!







In one landmark study,* advantaged children in the U.S. heard as many as 30 million more words by the age of 3 compared to children whose families were receiving public assistance.






















Poem: The Caregiver's Promise
