

# Major Opportunity!

1003.428. General requirements for high school graduation; revised.


(1) ... beginning with students entering their first year of high school in the 2007-2008 school year, graduation requires the successful completion of a minimum of 24 credits, an International Baccalaureate curriculum, or an Advanced International Certificate of Education curriculum.



### Standard Diploma (24 credits)

### Lifsa Major Lopportunity!

The 24 credits may be earned through applied, integrated, and combined courses approved by the Department of Education and shall be distributed as follows:





Graduation Requirements for Students Entering 9th Grade in 2007-2008

16 core curriculum credits:

- 4 credits in English
- 4 credits in mathematics
- 3 credits in science
- 3 credits in social studies
- 1 credit in fine arts
- 1 credit in physical education to include the integration of health


# What were the changes?

the Fine Arts requirement is no longer broken down to include practical arts career/technical education or exploratory career education

one-half credit of Life Management Skills (Health Education) is no longer required

Physical Education must include health information and is no longer defined as .5 personal fitness and .5 physical education elective

8.5 general electives are now defined as 4 MAI's and 4 general electives

# 4 Credits in a Major Area of Interest

Four (4) courses designated toward a MAI, that are <u>selected by the student</u> in one of the following areas:

- Career and technical program
- Fine and performing arts, or
- An academic content area





#### Some ideas behind the MAI's:

~ Make school interesting and engaging for today's students.

~ Make school relevant for their life/career choices.

~ Give student's opportunities to explore new things.

~ Give teachers a chance to share/mentor students who have similar interests.

~ Keep Florida's children in school!

## How Do Students Identify a Major Area of Interest?

- Discuss their individual interests with parent(s)/guardian(s), guidance counselors, and teachers.
- Explore their academic and career goals.
  - Use CHOICES to explore occupations and career interests (www.florida.access.bridges.com).
- Use FACTS.org to view major areas of interest that are being offered at the high school (<u>www.FACTS.org</u>).
- Identify a MAI and identify course(s) that are included in the chosen MAI, which are appropriate for 9<sup>th</sup> grade and update academic plan.






### It'sa Major Opportunity!

- elective courses,
- intensive reading or mathematics intervention courses.

Academic Planning:

It is very important for students to work with their guidance counselors, career specialists and teachers in order to identify and select courses in "major and/or minor areas of interest" to ensure that university admission and Florida Bright Futures Scholarship program requirements

are met, based on the student's desired postsecondary education goals.
