2006-2007 Accomplishments

- ✓ For a second consecutive year, the Broad Foundation has selected Miami-Dade County Public Schools as a finalist for its prestigious annual prize to the nation's most effective urban school district.
- An Education Council of International Cities (ECIC) has been established to prepare students to be competitive in today's global economy.
- ✓ **Secondary School Reform** has been initiated at 11 senior high schools, with plans to expand to 27 in the coming year.
- ✓ Thirteen Miami-Dade high schools were recognized by Newsweek Magazine as among the nation's best.
- √ 65,000 new student stations have been added to date, including nine new school facilities opened at the beginning of this school year.
- ✓ Education compacts have now been forged with six municipalities to focus energy on improving schools and saving public dollars.
- ✓ Enrollment in foreign language courses has increased by nearly 3,500 new students in two years
- The **Electronic Gradebook**, an interactive tool to let parents see their child's grades in progress and actively participate in their education is now online.
- ✓ The most common school performance grade is "A" in M-DCPS.
- ✓ Enrollment and performance excellence in **Advanced Placement** and gifted courses across the county has increased substantially, particularly among minority students.

Top 10 Accomplishments of 2005-2006


- The Broad Foundation selected Miami-Dade County Public Schools as **one of five** finalists for its prestigious annual prize to the nation's most effective urban school district after an independent review of data from the 100 largest school systems
- FCAT results continued to climb particularly in reading. More than **half** of the District's students read, do math proficiently for the **first time** and District median reading score tops national median for **first time**. 3rd graders, middle school students make big improvements
- For **first time**, more than **half** of District's schools earn A state accountability grade
- ✓ 11 high schools selected to launch major reform of secondary schools, including internships or dual enrollment in college for all students
- Seven high schools recognized by College Board for having the largest numbers of students in 2005 succeeding on college-level Advanced Placement exams in 2005; this year's AP enrollment up by 13% Districtwide over last year
- \$855 million in new construction begun this year, with 20,476 new student stations expected to be ready for next school year
- ✓ Building maintenance costs down by 21 cents per square foot a 6% cut
- ✓ Crimes in schools down 8.5% from last year
- Pilot performance pay plan begun for senior administrators, 24 principals
- Historic education compacts forged with City of Miami, Miami-Dade County, Coral Gables and Hialeah to focus energy on improving schools, saving public dollars through economies of scale

Top 10 Accomplishments Of 2004-2005

- District awarded **B** in state accountability system, up from a C. Schools receiving A from state grew to **48%** highest number ever despite tougher state standards and schools receiving repeat F cut to 3 a **66%** reduction
- 3rd graders considered proficient readers rose to 61% the highest ever and 1,814 fewer 3rd graders are at risk of being held back due to reading scores
- 39 chronically low-performing schools placed in "School Improvement Zone" with extended school day and year, common reading program, and mandatory teacher training resulting in 97% of the schools registering performance gains in the state accountability system with 40% improving enough to raise their state grade
- \$44 million negotiating reserve carved from existing budget to give employees raises
- Reorganization of central office eliminated more than 500 positions, freeing up \$38 million for other educational needs
- Construction of **18,000** new student seats to address overcrowding more than **three times** the number planned by prior administration
- First comprehensive five-year capital plan developed, identifying \$3.3 billion in needs
- Bond rating firms improved their official outlook for M-DCPS based on administration's management of District's finances, including **50%** increase in "rainy day" fund
- Push for performance-based pay, with part of Superintendent's salary tied to 22 measurable objectives 13 of which were met in full, 5 of which were met in part and plan for performance incentives for all top administrators
- ✓ Extensive public outreach through Superintendent's Town Hall Meetings, community meetings for Strategic Plan and Capital Plan, and sessions with teachers


More Than Half of M-DCPS Students Performing Proficiently

Percentage Students Grades 3-10 Reaching Proficiency




Most Miami-Dade Schools Earn A's

Percentage of Schools Earning State Grades




FCAT Reading

Percentage Reaching Proficiency By Grade




FCAT Math
