Dr. Rudy Crew became Superintendent of Miami-Dade County Public Schools on July 1, 2004, following a nationwide search by the fourth-largest school district in the nation. Dr. Crew has defined three priorities for the school district: eliminating low-performing schools, increasing academic achievement for all students, and bringing cost-efficiency to the district's construction and business practices.

In 2006 and 2007, Miami-Dade Country Public Schools was selected as a finalist for the Broad Prize for Urban Education for the following reasons: Miami-Dade outperformed other Florida districts serving students with similar income levels in reading and math at all grade levels; Miami-Dade's lowincome, African-American and Hispanic student subgroups outperformed their peers in similar districts in reading and math at all levels; and Miami-Dade has reduced achievement gaps between African-American and Hispanic students and their White peers in math at all levels.

Miami Edison Senior is part of the High Schools that Work (HSTW) network, a set of schools in 32 states that are using the framework of HSTW Goals and Key Practices to raise student achievement. The school has four career academies: Academy of Business and Finance, Academy of Communication and Digital Technology, Academy of Law Studies and Public Service, and Academy of Medicine and Health. In two years, Miami Edison Senior, a School Improvement Zone member, has completely altered its culture and learning environment. This was exemplified in 2006-07, when the school got off the "F-list" for the first time in six years. Strong leadership has taken one of Miami's darkest corners and turned it into a shining star.

MacArthur South Senior High School (Mac South) originated in 1973 as an alternative high school to assist students who experience difficulties in the traditional school environment. Over the past few years, Mac South has undergone considerable change and reconfiguration to provide a more effective and comprehensive educational program for the children of Miami Dade County. The school's success over the past several years is the cornerstone of the district's new alternative education program, Highways to Success, and the school has recently transitioned into a 6th-grade-to-12th-grade (6-12), single-gender model to serve young men. Mac South was the first alternative school to vote with overwhelming majority to become one of the first 11 high schools to institute the Secondary School Reform plan.

Robert Morgan Educational Center has eight career academies: Academy of Hospitality & Tourism; Design Arts & Entertainment; Engineering; Health Sciences; Information Technology and Business Services; Performing, Recording, and Visual Arts; Specialty Service Industry; and Technical Career Services. There are two parts to the success story at the Robert Morgan Educational Center: 1) the high school has a "wall-to-wall" academy model, which offers students academic preparation and vocational hands-on experience; and 2) the acclaimed adult/vocational, technical school prepares students, and up to 1,500 registered adults, for new careers and technical training.
