Dr. Alicia Sasser Modestino

Associate Professor with appointments in the School of Public Policy and Urban Affairs and the Department of Economics at Northeastern University

Alicia Sasser Modestino is an Associate Professor with appointments in the School of Public Policy and Urban Affairs and the Department of Economics at Northeastern University. Dr. Modestino also serves as the Research Director of the Dukakis Center for Urban and Regional Policy and is a nonresident fellow at the Brookings Institution. Previously, Modestino was a Senior Economist at the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston where she advised policymakers on regional economic issues.

Dr. Modestino's current research focuses on youth labor market attachment, skills mismatch, and the future of work. She currently leads a multi-year program evaluation of the Boston Summer Youth Employment Program funded by the William T. Grant Foundation. Her work has been published in top journals including the Review of Economics and Statistics, Journal of Human Resources, and Journal of Policy Analysis and Management and has been covered extensively in the media including the Wall Street Journal, New York Times, NPR's On Point and ABC News' Nightline.

Modestino holds both a Master's and a Ph.D. in Economics from Harvard University, where she was also a doctoral fellow in the Inequality and Social Policy Program at the Harvard Kennedy School.
